

TOP TIPS – BUNDLING NEWSPAPER RETURNS

Sensible Bundle Size

For Health & Safety and handling reasons bundle size should never be larger than those that are delivered to your store. e.g. Full strapped bundles.

Clearly Labelled

Ensures bundles are clearly identified when they arrive back at the wholesaler for processing - removes shrink risk!

Tied Securely

Tight and secure bundles are easier to handle and ensure that return bundles arrive at the wholesaler as you prepared them - removes shrink risk!

TYING YOUR BUNDLE – LOOP & PULL METHOD



Tie a loop at the end of the string and cut a length long enough to wrap around your pile of newspapers, both length and width ways.



Tie a knot against the loop to hold this in position, ensuring the knot is in a central position on top of the pile of newspapers.



Tighten by pulling back against the knot, ideally retuning the knot to a central position.



Place the end of the string with the loop, width ways, under the middle of the pile of newspapers.



Now take string the length ways under the pile of newspapers, pulling this as tight as you can. This should see the knot pulled towards the top of the pile.



Finally tie a knot or a couple of knots to secure the bundle.



Thread the other end of the string through the loop, pull so that this tightens the bundle.



Take the end of the string over the loop, thread underneath the other end of the length strap and then back over the middle strap toward you.



This is now easy to handle and be placed in the agreed location for Wholesale collection the following morning.
